Mark Hughes is a former professional rugby league player who played in two premiership-winning teams for the Newcastle Knights and represented NSW in State of Origin.

In 2013, at the age of 36, he was dealt the devastating blow of being diagnosed with high-grade brain cancer. Brain cancer has no cure, and treatments have not improved in over 30 years. However, out of this, the Mark Hughes Foundation was born, and to date, over 35 million dollars has been raised to help find a cure for this hideous disease.
